On December 3, ILoveLibraries.org (an initiative of ALA) shared the good news that IMLS Library grants have been restored thanks to a lawsuit by twenty-one states. Read the full article at this link.

Despite this positive outcome, the article reminds us that there is still work to be done to ensure future funding of the Institute of Museum and Library Services by Congress.

"It is more than just a display of artistic talent," say the organizers. "The exhibit was created with purpose. The photographer generously donated the use of the digital photographs to help raise


not only highlighted his passion for visual storytelling but also his commitment to supporting the library's mission and enriching the cultural life of Hays."

The exhibit and fundraiser will be on view at the Hays Public Library until January 31.


