Focus on Friends

Friends of Ellis Library Celebrate First Year of Library Friendship


The Friends of the Ellis Public Library hit the ground running in their first year of returning to operation after a hiatus since 1994. Director Tracy Andrews calls them a creative, motivated group that gets things done. The Friends have taken on fundraising and grant writing projects, and now offer a variety of programs and support that benefit the library and community. Highlights of their year —



- The group's first major event was to host a library **Open House** and membership drive with hot dogs, beverages, and games. The group's FB page said, "The library was buzzing with excitement. Children lit up the room with their laughter and energy during Book Bingo, while adults enjoyed reconnecting and catching up in our welcoming space. The sense of community was truly heartwarming." In addition to gaining new members, the event raised over half the funds needed for their first big project — installing two ADA-compliant refrigerated water fountains with bottle-filling capabilities.

- Their **Bunco Nights** are fun fundraisers with a great turnout.
- **Wednesday Coffee** is now a weekly library feature with the coffee bar established by the Friends. Conversations are lively, with recent discussions centering on recipes "made by memory."
- Group members serve as **Volunteers** with community events including the Ellis Polar Express and mini carnival last night at the Ellis Jr Free Fair. They were also seen at Ellis's "Christmas in July" event and helping with trick-or-treat at the library.
- The group celebrated **Project Success** for their first major fundraising project when the two water fountains were installed in October (photos below).
- To attract new people to the library, all visitors can now get a free ticket for the **Friends Monthly Give Away**. This month's drawing is for a candle warmer with a built-in timer.
- Coming up, the group will celebrate their first year of accomplishments at their **Annual Meeting** on February 1 at 2pm. Angela Bates will present "Children of the Promised Land," a program made possible by Humanities Kansas.




Clay Center Friends



News from Friends of Wichita Public Library

The Friends of Wichita Public Library is offering an opportunity to win two free tickets to a VIP author event and selling a new promotional sticker.


The [Wichita Library Foundation](#) is partnering with Watermark Books to host an author's event in February. Bestselling author, Kate Quinn, will be featured in a program that is open to the public on Thursday, February 19, at the Advanced Learning Library in Wichita from 6:30 to 7:30 pm. Director of Wichita Public Libraries, Jaime Nix, will interview Quinn during the program about her latest book, *The Astral Library*, as well as her other historical fiction work. Signed copies of the new book may be purchased online in advance for \$32. [Reservations](#) are required to attend the free event and space is limited.

Prior to the public event, a private VIP reception will be held at the Advanced Learning Library (711 W. 2nd St. N.) from 5:30 - 6:30 pm, hosted by the Wichita Library Foundation. The ticketed event includes a signed hardcover copy of the new book as well as wine, bites and a signature cocktail. Tickets for the meet and greet are \$100 each and space is limited.

The [Friends of Wichita Public Library](#) (FWPL) is providing an opportunity to win two tickets (valued at \$200) to the VIP event. Existing Platinum and Library Champion members are automatically enrolled in the drawing as a membership benefit. Those who become a new Friends member or renew their annual membership at the Library Champion level (\$150) will also be entered to win. Library Champion memberships may be purchased online or in person at the Friends bookstore in the Advanced Learning Library. Memberships must be purchased by 11:59 p.m. on January 31, 2026 to be eligible. The winner will be notified February 6.



FWPL is also offering a new sticker for sale as a fundraiser for library programs. The sticker is 2.5 inches square and replicates the popular red yard sign that the organization started selling last year. It can be purchased for \$2 at the Friends used bookstore in the Advanced Learning Library during operating hours (Monday through Saturday from 10:30 am to 4:30 pm). Yard signs are also still available for sale at a price of \$10.
